HAC Group 5 Motorkhana – April 14th at Pakenham

A good field of 35 drivers contested the HAC round of the Group 5 Non-speed (Motorkhana) Series at the PAC ground at Pakenham. With a small club such as HAC it is always difficult the get enough officials to run the event smoothly, but with the assistance of our own members and helpers from other clubs, the day went off without a hitch. As usual at



PAC, catering from the Garrads kicked off the day with tasty breakfast and then more good food during the day. **Mike Exell** was assisted by Owen Crombie (AHSDC) for scrutiny, and Bob deBont (MX5 Club), young **Alex Smith** and Oscar C from Skylines Australia (an online club) assisted **Chris** and **Jenny** with timing duties, while **John R** looked after scoring and results. The event was directed by **David Isherwood**, whose work was made easier by all the helpers including competitors during the day.

Possibly due to the added burden of running the event, no HAC members



came away with a trophy, despite the fact we had nine members competing.

In the Specials class, **Aaron Wuillemin** came closest with a very close second behind Outright winner, **Bill McCarthy** with less than a second separating them after the nine tests were completed.



Blair Jones continued to show form with third Outright, just ahead of **Mike Exell** who scored one garage penalty. Other HAC members in the Class were **Rob Holtkamp** (one flag), **Phillip East** down again from NSW (one WD) and **Terry Jones** (one flag). **Daniel** and **Nathan Wuillemin** were having some fun in Class A in their Honda Civic instead of the usual Special, and finished 3rd and 6th respectively in Class.



Young driver **Jacob Smith** showed his improved skills by placing fifth despite a couple of penalties in the very competitive Juniors Class.



Overall the event went off very well and we managed to pack up and leave just before the weather turned sour about 3.30pm. A big thank you to all those who took part.

MOTORKHANA REPORTS

NGK VMC Round 3 – April 28th at Deniliquin (NSW)

We haven't been able to prove it yet, but the popular event at Deni has probably been held continuously since at least 1975. This year's event though may not have happened at all without the support of HAC, such was our club's involvement.

The host club is suffering from a severe shortage of qualified, fit officials, and so HAC was able to assist with **Chris Exell**, **Jenny Rosengrave** and potential new



member Jay Morris handling the timing, Nathan's partner Kim entering the

results and many other HAC members were helping out during the day. On top of that our Club also had 13 out of the 31 competitors at the event – a great effort! **Aaron Wuillemin** continued his winning form, scoring his 2nd Outright win for the 2013 NGK VMC season, finishing nine seconds clear of fellow HAC members **Nathan Wuillemin** and **Blair Jones** who were separated by less than



two seconds in the minor placings. **Mike Exell** dropped some time in the very dusty conditions and **Rob Holtkamp** had three flag penalties, but they still placed 5th and 6th Outright. **Daniel Wuillemin** scored four flag penalties on the way to eighth Outright.



Newly rejoined member **Phillip East** from NSW won Class C from **Andrew Lau** and **David Isherwood**,



making it a clean sweep of the top three placings for HAC.



Elliott Barnfather and John Rosengrave shared Elliott's Golf fresh from some extensive mechanical work, but were no match for the Class A winning Minis, finishing 4th and 5th in Class, followed by **Cameron Stewart** enjoying his first run in his Daihatsu Charade. Most of HAC's Class F (Specials) drivers placed at the head of the Class, except for **Terry Jones** who collected two flags and had

some difficulties in the dusty conditions.



Many HAC members also took part in the popular Autocross the day before the motorkhana, and combined with a very enjoyable get-together at the local RSL club on Saturday night, the weekend proved as popular as ever.

Next NGK VMC Round will be on Sunday June 23rd at Sandown, run by the PCCV.

NGK VMC Round 4 – May 12th at Sandown

Despite being held on Mother's Day, a good field of 41 drivers turned up for the Nissan Club's Round of the NGK Series. Of those, 11 were HAC were HAC members, representing over one quarter of the field, and in addition **Chris Exell** and **Pete Morden** lent a hand with the timing.

The venue at Sandown is a bit on the tight side, so only two tests (with minimal dimensions) can be run at the one time, but most competitors seemed to enjoy being on a hard surface. The bitumen however does have a coating of fine gravel and dust which reduces grip (and leads to severe tyre wear) but most of us are prepared for that!



Most HAC members had a successful day, and results showed we took out six of the top ten outright places, and first or second places in four of the Classes or Categories. **Mike Exell** scored his first Outright win for the year, placing ahead of **Aaron Wuillemin**

and Bill McCarthy, then followed by **Nathan** and **Daniel Wuillemin**,



Rob Holtkamp, Elliott Barnfather, Blair Jones and Andrew Lau all placing in the top 11. There were a few hard luck stories on the day, as Blair Jones,



Nathan Wuillemin, John Rosengrave and Terry Jones each scored penalties to restrict their chances of better



placings. In the classes Elliott Barnfather and John Rosengrave, in their own VW Golfs this event, could not match Matt Webb's Mini for pace, but nevertheless scored 2nd and 3rd in Class A, and the same in Category M behind Bill McCarthy. **Andrew Lau** took top place in Class C (despite



complaining of understeer on the slippery surface) ahead of David Isherwood having a rare run at a bitumen event in his VW Polo. Class F reflected the Outright placings with HAC members taking 6 of the top 7 placings, and Mike Exell a clear winner with fastest times in four of the eight tests held. Nathan Wuillemin was heading for second outright until a flag penalty in the last test dropped him to fourth place overall.

Next round of the NGK VMC Series will also be at the Sandown venue, organised by the Peugeot Club on **Sunday, June 23rd**. Before that, the HSCCV organised Group 5 round on **June 2nd** will provide some more practice at the same venue – just remember to bring some old tyres!

NEWS

Largely due to the good work put in by Club member, **Aaron Wuillemin**, NGK have again signed on as Series Sponsor for the Victorian Motorkhana Championship. At the Presentation Night in December, it was pleasing to have NGK Guests **Brad Farmer** and **Akino Miura** as well as new CAMS CEO **Eugene Arocca** in attendance and presenting the 2012 State Motorkhana Awards. The NGK funding is proving very helpful in enabling us to present a more professional approach to our State events, and this will filter down to help boost participation at all levels of motorkhanas. NGK is also separately supporting Junior drivers with the NGK Spark Plugs Junior Pentathlon Series, which is open to all drivers aged between 14 and 21 years. It is designed to encourage young driver participation in 5 motorsport pentathlon disciplines - Motorkhana, Khanacross, Autocross, Sprint and Hillclimb. See attachment for Series Regulations.

At (long) last, it appears the TCCA motorkhana/autocross venue at Werribee is back in use again. After gradually falling into disrepair due to floods, vandalism and general lack of use, apparently much work has been spent to get the ground back into top condition, so we can again look forward to this venue close to the city. First event was a shakedown/practice event on Saturday, February 2nd, followed by Round 1 of the 2013 VMC Series on February 24th. These events have been successfully completed, however the usual Werribee problem of dust was still a problem. Hopefully after some good rain and some more maintenance the venue will prove to be a welcome addition again to our (small) list of suitable motorkhana venues.

Another interesting venue development is the bitumen pad being constructed at Winton Raceway. The entire former cricket oval is being laid with high-quality bitumen, and will be available as a multi-purpose venue for displays, trade shows, and of course motorkhanas! It has been funded with the aid of a substantial Government grant, so apparently the cost of hire to car clubs will be kept to an affordable amount. It should be available for use after September this year. Motorkhana events will be able to be held even if other events are taking place on the circuit. Benalla Auto Club to be congratulated on this is initiative.

INTERNATIONAL RALLY NEWS

Australian International rally driver Chris Atkinson is set to rejoin the Citroen fold for round three of the 2013 World Rally Championship in Mexico next month. Chris had a one-off run with the Citroen Junior team in Ireland at the start of 2009 after losing his <u>Subaru</u> seat at the end of the previous year when the works team withdrew. Atkinson subsequently dropped out of the WRC, focusing mainly on Proton's Asia-Pacific programme, before returning for a one-off appearance with <u>Monster Ford</u> in Mexico last year and later completing the season in a Motorsport Italia Mini.

Thanks to a \$3 million re-surfacing in December 2012, the track at Phillip Island should now be in fantastic condition, and ready for the World Superbike round on February 22-24, and then the Phillip Island Classic meeting (cars and bikes) on March 8-10. 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After a long-term downward trend in motor vehicle theft in Australia, the past financial year saw theft numbers rise for the first time in a decade, increasing by 5% to a total of 59,874 thefts. This equates to an increase of approximately 8 vehicle thefts per day making up a total of 164 motor vehicles stolen every day in 2011/12. It should be noted that thefts have dropped dramatically since 2000/01, at which time an average of 382 vehicles were stolen each day.

In 2011/12, the increase was seen across all vehicle body types with passenger/light commercial vehicles up 6%, motorcycles up 4% and other vehicles up 3%. Almost half (47%) were stolen from the victims own home which indicates the need for owners to better protect their car keys and use secure off street parking where possible.

Short term theft increased by 7% since 2010/11 which was slightly more than the increase in profit-motivated theft (+5%). The largest increases in short term thefts were seen in Queensland (+25%) and Western Australia (+15%). Of the larger jurisdictions, Western Australia (+20%) and Queensland (18%) also had the largest increases in profit-motivated thefts.

Passenger/light commercial vehicles (PLCs):

- More than two-fifths (44%) of PLCs stolen for short term purposes did not have an immobiliser.
- Half (51%) of short term PLC thefts were valued at less than \$5,000 and a further 17% were valued between \$5,000 and \$9,999.

Motorcycles

- One quarter (26%) of all profit motivated thefts in 2011/12 were motorcycles, which is three times more than among short term thefts (8%).
- One third (33%) of motorcycles stolen (with a known engine capacity) for short term purposes were 50cc or less which suggests that scooters are most commonly stolen and recovered.
